Each school review generates a number of key improvement strategies to inform continuous improvement in all state schools. The next steps are...

- Further refine the explicit improvement agenda, including articulation of clear and precise actions, aspirational targets and timelines to drive progress and achieve measurable improvement in outcomes for all students.
- Fully implement guaranteed and viable curriculum, including alignment to the Australian Curriculum, and quality assure its consistent enactment across Years 7 to 10.
- Enhance the instructional leadership skills of all members of the senior leadership team to support a cohesive, coordinated and systematic approach to school improvement.
- Strengthen the culture of self-evaluation and reflection that enables executive leaders, heads of department and teachers to engage in deeper discussions of data, and generate strategies for continuous improvement at the classroom level.
- Collaboratively develop and enact informal approaches and formal strategies to build trusting relationships and enhance transparency of decision making.
