# Ensure your child's computer is ready for Windows 11

From Tuesday 14 October 2025, <u>Microsoft will no longer support any device using Windows 10</u> as an operating system. As a result, any computer using a Windows 10 operating system (OS) may experience issues with connecting to the school network or accessing certain learning resources. This is because, after this date, Windows 10 will no longer receive security protection and updates from Microsoft, putting school and student information at risk.

If you do not already have Windows 11 installed, it is strongly recommended that you upgrade your child's computer to Windows 11 as soon as possible. If the device is incompatible with Windows 11, you may need to explore replacement options.

I have Windows 10. How do I know if my device is compatible?
Users can also download the free Microsoft Windows PC Health Check App which will evaluate whether a device can be upgraded to Windows 11.

My device is compatible. Where can I access the upgrade? The download of the latest Windows 11 OS media release can be obtained from the Microsoft here.

Do you have any guides on how to install the update? You can access a Youtube video on how to use the Windows 11 Installation Assistant to upgrade a standard Windows 10 device to Windows 11 here.

My computer does not meet the requirements. What are the specifications if I was looking for a new computer?
