COURSE DESCRIPTION

Hospitality is a two year course with a multi-skilled approach. This course enables students to develop and practice skills in food and beverage production and service.

Students will work as individuals and as part of teams to plan and implement events in a hospitality context.

Students will be trained in the basics of food production, service skills, coffee operations, and non - alcoholic beverage service.



Special Requirements:

Students may be required to attend functions which sometimes occur outside of scheduled class time.

Hospitality Career Pathways

The hospitality industry offers many diverse career opportunities and quality staff are in demand in popular tourist venues all over the world.

Career opportunities may range from working in a fixed venue like a coffee shop or restaurant, to working on a cruise ship or resort, or being a self employed caterer delivering pre-prepared meals to a site or location. Other pathways may include: chef, cook, barista, bar attendant, food or beverage manager, event management, and food photography.

There are an abundance of job prospects with the opportunity for world-wide travel and many higher level jobs attract good wages.

Many people also work in the hospitality industry to support themselves whilst completing further study.



Assessment

Students are required to demonstrate competency to industry standards across a range of hospitality areas and in a variety of settings. Course work will involve both written and practical assessment in the form of: folio work, research tasks, class activities, practical class work, and functions.

They have opportunities to develop personal attributes that contribute to employability; including the ability to communicate, connect and work with others, plan, organise, solve problems, and navigate the world of work

Functions

Hospitality functions provide opportunities for students to practice their skills to industry standards in simulated work environments.

Functions also enable students to contribute to the whole school community by providing quality hospitality at various school events for visitors to the school as well as for staff and students.
