TOURISM - (Applied)

Tourism develops an understanding and appreciation of the tourism industry and its impact

on economic, social and environmental aspects of our lifestyle and that of host communities when travelling.



Students are provided with intellectual, operational workplace

skills as well as personal attributes and interpersonal skills. Students will develop specific skills related to the tourism and hospitality industries.

Futures Perspective – TAFE course links; traineeships/apprenticeships in a variety of career paths including tour owner-operator, travel supervisor, tour coordinator, tour guide, or employment at a theme park, a tourist attraction or other tourism and travel related organisations.

Topics include – The Nature of Tourism, The Work Environment, Marketing of Tourism, Overseas Destinations, Travel Agency Operations, Tour Guiding, Cultural Awareness and Tourism and Special Even
